We welcome papers and presentations that address participation, performance and partnership within the following main areas:

- University LLL in urban environments to enhance learning communities
- Universities promoting LLL through skills development and effective HRD
- Universities' roles in enhancing sustainable environment and social inclusion through LLL

# Topic 1 – University LLL in urban environments to enhance learning communities

This session of the **eucen** 2022 Conference will discuss challenging aspects of learning cities, regions and of learning communities - in the scope of smart, creative and inclusive urban learning environments - to highlight the lifelong learning responsibilities of universities.

According to international trends and practices of sustainable cities and communities represented by UNESCO, the OECD, PASCAL International Observatory and ASEM LLL HUB, this session welcomes abstracts:

- dealing with initiatives, practices and working models of learning cities and communities enhancing participation in association with HEIs, pointing out specific topics and issues;
- focusing on particular dimensions of learning communities in urban settings to promote health and well-being by engaging with universities;
- pointing to the importance of learning city-regions to build sustainable, resilient and inclusive learning communities based on equity, equality and solidarity towards vulnerable and underrepresented groups in urban settings;
- relating to urban developments and innovations to smart and creative city paths in partnerships with relevant stakeholders by signalling HEIs' RDI roles.

# Topic 2 – Universities promoting LLL through skills development and effective HRD

This specific session of the eucen2022 Conference will discuss particular aspects of workplace and work-based lifelong learning. Based on ILO- and OECD-led discourse around the future of work, we welcome abstracts:

- dealing with practical implications of skills and competence developments as proactive HRD through workplaces recognised as learning organisations;
- showing HRD/HRM and HR Counselling practices based, on the one hand, on lifelong learning and skills development at challenging times of technological and digital innovations, artificial intelligence;
- opening, on the other hand, to social dimensions of fair, equitable, accessible solutions for learning organisations in line with UN SDG8 upon decent work and economic growth, and
- highlighting roles and responsibilities of HEIs in the future of lifelong learning in the context of effective and efficient people management.

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# Topic 3 – Universities' roles in enhancing sustainable environment and social inclusion through LLL

This session of the eucen2022 Conference will provide an open discussion to elaborate upon sustainable environments and social inclusion. The session will reflect upon some profound examples of university lifelong learning to emphasize living and learning in sustainable ways through partnership, resilience in good governance and active citizenship.

Therefore, in line with UN Agenda 2030, its Sustainable Development Goals and the recent UNESCO publication on Embracing a Culture of Lifelong Learning, this session will welcome abstracts:

- reflecting special forms of education and lifelong learning for sustainable development through/for social inclusion in order to address matters of equal opportunities, access and other relevant ethical concerns where universities have a clear position, role and responsibility;
- demonstrating universities' commitment towards lifelong learning and collaborations with stakeholders in their local-regional space for sustainable economic and social development, through innovative methods and means connected to green principles and values;
- showing living and working models of solidarity economy and inclusion supported by university lifelong learning for growth, competitiveness, and employability in the risk society.

### **Papers**

The next issue of the European Journal of University Lifelong Learning <u>EJULL</u> will expand on the themes raised during eucen's 52<sup>nd</sup> Annual Conference in Budapest (08-10 June 2022). The themes addressed in this current issue are in line with the topics of the call:

- University LLL in urban environments to enhance learning communities
- Universities promoting LLL through skills development and effective HRD
- Universities' roles in enhancing sustainable environment and social inclusion through LLL

We are happy to accept three kinds of papers:

- 1. **Research papers** drawing on theoretical debates or empirical research, contextualized within current national and international policy debate, which develop the theoretical base of the field or report on significant research done; Length: max. 3000-5000 words
- 2. **Innovative Practice/Short papers** including critical evaluations to share and discuss specific projects or practical approaches that either are in progress or have been completed;

Length: max. 2000-3000 words

 Discussion papers presenting informed opinion and reflection on current research and policy developments on university lifelong learning. Length: max. 1000-2000 words

All research papers undergo a double-blind review. Innovative practice/short papers and discussion papers are reviewed by one of the editorial board members.

- Deadline submission of Abstracts: 3-1-March-2022- 22 APRIL 2022
- Feedback from the Editorial Board to authors: -22 April 2022 -- 06 MAY 2022
- Deadline submission full papers 30 June 2022
- Feedback to authors on reviews 14 September 2022
- Deadline for authors to submit revised papers 30 September 2022
- Publication date November 2022
